More 'man caves' found at EPA warehouse

The Environmental Protection Agency's internal watchdog has discovered more misuse of government warehouses, beyond the "man caves" for weightlifting and watching TV revealed last year at a government facility in suburban Washington.

Contract employees were using an EPA facility in Woburn, Mass., for personal purposes, according to the latest findings published Monday from a warehouse audit by agency Inspector General Arthur A. Elkins, Jr.

"The EPA contractors at the Woburn, Mass. warehouse engaged in unauthorized activities such as having personal packages received at the EPA warehouse, storing and potentially using exercise equipment and bicycle repair equipment, and storing personal sleeping bags in vacant spaces," Elkins said.

The misuse of government space reflected EPA's weak management of 62 leased and government-owned facilities. Those sites include more than 500,000 square feet of

capacity to store equipment, furniture and documents.

The department has since moved to comply with nine reform recommendations by Elkins, such as conducting annual inventories, strengthening controls of contractors and freeing up unused space. Those actions could save taxpayers up to nearly \$9 million, he said.

The audit report is the third by Elkins on EPA's problems at its warehouses. He began last year with a look at the disposal of excess government computers.

In the audit, which ran through August, Elkins examined eight EPA sites with combined annual management contract costs of \$50 million.

That probe followed past reviews by his office of EPA's inventory management in 2009 and 2011. His investigation in 2011 found that EPA had lost track of 638 computers with a combined value of more than \$1 million.

A management alert Elkins issued in May 2013 got national attention when it detailed the use of weightlifting equipment and construction of personal hideaways to watch TV and sleep -- known as "man caves" -- by contractor staff at an EPA warehouse in Landover, Md.

The same was found at the Massachusetts site, which Elkins said happened in part because EPA did not periodically review operations at the facilities.

The two sites were being run for EPA at a combined cost of about \$1.6 million a year. EPA subsequently ended its contract for management of the Landover site.

Elkins issued a second alert in March after his staff discovered last year that an EPA warehouse in Blue Ash, Ohio, near Cincinnati, was holding a six-year supply of publications rather than printing them as needed.

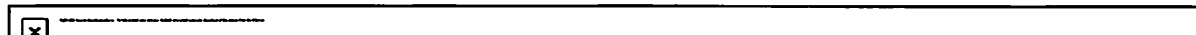
Elkins estimated the oversupply was costing taxpayers more than \$1.5 million annually.

EPA last year, in response to visits by staff for Elkins, recycled more than 2 million documents from the warehouse that amounted to more than 140 tons.

He also scored EPA for maintaining stocks of supplies, such as refrigerators, envelopes and toner cartridges at four locations -- materials that could be easily obtained from commercial suppliers. The agency at the same time was unaware that some of the stocks existed because of inadequate records.

The agency responded to the probe by disposing of unused property to other federal and state agencies, in moves that will save taxpayers \$3.5 million.

An EPA spokeswoman on Monday had no additional comment on the report, but noted that the agency had accepted recommendations by Elkins and was acting on them.

Energy stocks lead a decline as price of oil sinks

NEW YORK (AP) — Stocks were closing lower, led by a slump in energy stocks after the price of crude oil sank again.

Exxon Mobil and Chevron were among the biggest decliners in the Dow Jones industrial average Monday.

The Dow lost 106 points, or 0.6 percent, to 17,852.

High court rejects BP appeal of spill settlement

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — The Supreme Court is leaving in place BP's multibillion-dollar settlement with lawyers for businesses and residents over the 2010 oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

The justices did not comment Monday in rejecting the London-based oil giant's arguments that lower courts misinterpreted settlement terms and put BP on the hook to pay inflated and bogus claims by businesses.

The court's decision makes the economic and property damage settlement final, starting a six-month deadline for filing claims, said plaintiffs' attorney Joe Rice of Mount Pleasant, South Carolina.

BP PLC wanted the court to consider whether people and businesses seeking payments under the settlement included some who haven't actually suffered any injury related to the spill.

Justices seem divided over Amtrak regulatory role

WASHINGTON (AP) — Supreme Court justices exchanged conflicting viewpoints Monday on whether Amtrak had the legal authority to help craft federal regulations over the use of railroad tracks.

The court heard arguments over a 2008 law that directed Amtrak to work with government agencies to develop new standards for improving the passenger railroad's on-time performance.

The American Association of Railroads, which represents the freight railroad industry, says it's unconstitutional for Congress to give a private company the power to create regulations. The industry objects to some of the new standards that allow

Amtrak to keep its priority over freight trains that share common railroad tracks.

The Obama administration argues that Amtrak simply worked with the Federal Railroad Administration to devise the rules and, at any rate, the government retained ultimate control over how they were approved. The government is appealing a decision from the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit which sided with the freight railroads.

GOP seeks to ease regulations on spending bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — Republicans sought to ease federal regulations on the trucking industry, financial sector, federally-funded school lunch program and more on Monday in last-minute bargaining over a \$1.1 trillion spending bill to keep the government operating past a Thursday midnight deadline.

The funding legislation was one of a handful of must-pass items clogging the agenda for lawmakers eager to adjourn for the new year. Others were bills to extend dozens of expiring tax breaks, authorize President Barack Obama's policy of arming Syrian rebels to fight Islamic state forces and a Democratic drive to confirm as many administration nominees as possible before the Republicans take control of the Senate in January.

Legislation to continue preventing state or local governments from imposing a tax on Internet access also seems likely to make it to Obama's desk.

There was relatively little controversy over spending levels themselves in what was shaping up as a classic year-end measure that rolled numerous unrelated issues into a single package. The \$1.1 trillion in total spending adhered to spending caps approved in previous negotiations between Obama and House Republicans. It included more than \$5 billion of the \$6.2 billion the president requested to fight Ebola at home and overseas.

Feds: Don't blame California drought on warming

By Seth Borenstein

WASHINGTON (AP) — Don't blame man-made global warming for the devastating California drought, a new federal report says.

A report issued Monday by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said natural variations — mostly a La Nina weather oscillation — were the primary

drivers behind the drought that has now stretched to three years.

Study lead author Richard Seager of Columbia University said the paper has not yet been published in a peer-reviewed scientific journal. He and NOAA's Martin Hoerling said 160 runs of computer models show heat-trapping gases should slightly increase winter rain in parts of California, not decrease.

"The conditions of the last three winters are not the conditions that climate change models say would happen," Hoerling said. But he said the La Nina, which is the cooler flip side of the warming of central Pacific ocean, can only be blamed for about one-third of the drought. The rest of the causes can be from just random variation, he said.

Poland rejects toxic waste sent from El Salvador

WARSAW, Poland (AP) — Poland has decided to refuse a toxic waste shipment from El Salvador that was to be destroyed at an incineration plant in a southern town, environment officials said Monday, after the local community raised concerns.

The 69 tons of liquid and solid waste, and contaminated earth, from a pesticide plant in El Salvador is en route by sea, where it was to be burned at the SARP Industries plant in Dabrowa Gornicza this month.

Environment Minister Maciej Grabowski said after talks at the ministry that the plant director decided against accepting the waste.

Grabowski pointed to protests by residents, who argue that the presence and the processing of the waste will add to the already polluted air of the industrial, coal mining town.
