Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statues (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light (FPL or Company) requests an extension of confidential classification of certain information originally filed in Docket No. 20210001-EI, dated March 8, 2021.

The Company is claiming confidentiality of its filing under Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S. Per the Statute, propriety of confidential business information includes, but is not limited to: Subsection (e) "[i]nformation relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information."

More specifically, the information at issue relates to claimed proprietary and confidential technical information regarding a third-party's (to FPL) analysis of electric plant equipment failure. FPL asserts that if it cannot demonstrate to its third-party partners that the Company has the ability to protect those third-parties' confidential and proprietary business information, it will be less likely that FPL can secure contracts that benefit its customers.

Staff has reviewed the extension of confidentiality request. It is staff's opinion the request meets the criteria for an extension of confidentiality contained in Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S.
