A. Brief Company History

City Gas Company of Florida was incorporated 4/2/49 as a propane distributor headquartered in Hialeah, Florida, using underground pipelines. Starting in the late fifties, City Gas acquired a number of LP gas companies in Dade, Broward, and Brevard Counties. In 1960, natural gas became available, and the underground pipeline systems facilitated the conversion from LP to natural gas. Upon the conversion to natural gas, the Company became regulated under the Florida Public Service Commission. In 1964, City Gas was listed on the American Stock Exchange. City Gas is now the second largest natural gas utility in Florida.

B. Operating Territory

City Gas has two divisions, the "Miami Division" in Dade and Broward Counties, and the "Brevard Division" in Brevard County. The service area of the Miami Division embraces an area beginning with and including Lake Forest, Pembroke Park and Miramar in Broward County on the north, and extends southward into Dade County through and including Opa Locka, Hialeah, Hialeah Gardens, Medley, Miami Springs, Miami International Airport, Virginia Gardens, the City of Miami west of 27th Avenue, Coral Gables, West Miami, South Miami, and continuing further southward past Cutler Ridge. Parts of North Miami and North Miami Beach are also served as isolated systems.

The service area of the Brevard Division is Brevard County. This area includes the principal municipalities of Titusville, Merritt Island, Cape Canaveral, Cocoa, Cocoa Beach, Rockledge, Melbourne, West Melbourne, Indian

Harbour Beach, and contiguous areas in the County.

Statewide, the Company services over 80,000 customers. City Gas has natural gas franchises in the following cities:

Dade County: Opa-Locka, Hialeah, Hialeah Gardens, Medley,
Miami Springs, Coral Gables, West Miami, South
Miami, Sweetwater, North Miami (partial), North Miami
Beach (partial), and Virginia Gardens.

Broward County: Miramar

Brevard County: Titusville, Cape Canaveral, Cocoa, Cocoa Beach,

Rockledge, Melbourne, West Melbourne, Indian

Harbour Beach, and Palm Shores.

C. Major Goals and Objectives

City Gas recognizes responsibilities to its employees, its stockholders, its community, and its government. Its primary objective is to serve these distinct groups to the best of its ability.

Employees: To provide job opportunities, with pay and benefits consistent with those in the area; and to provide appropriate incentives to attract and

retain good employees.

Stockholders: To achieve our allowable return on investment, presently set at 15.75% by the FPSC; to achieve consistent growth in earnings and dividends, and customer growth of at least 2% per year.

Community: To provide continuous service based on professional standards at a reasonable cost, and to provide for expansion of facilities as needed.

Government: Compliance with all laws and regulations, including proper and timely reporting as required, and payment of taxes. The Company also accepts a responsibility in assisting Government at all levels in recognizing new developments and the need for improvements in the law.

D. Major Operating Divisions and Functions

City Gas has two major divisions as explained in B above:
The Miami Division and the Brevard Division. The primary function of each
Division is natural gas distribution. In addition, each Division is engaged
in nonutility operations for merchandising and jobbing, and appliance leasing;
all for the purpose of adding or retaining natural gas load.

E. Affiliates and Relationships

The only affiliate of City Gas is a wholly-owned subsidiary, Essel Corporation , in Dade County.

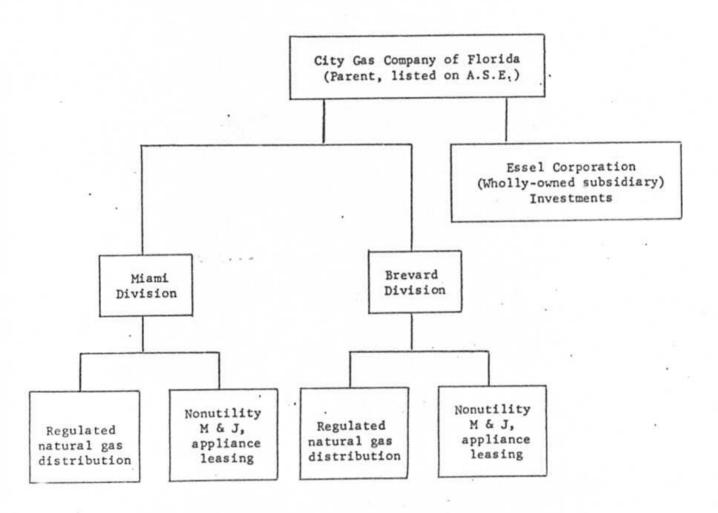

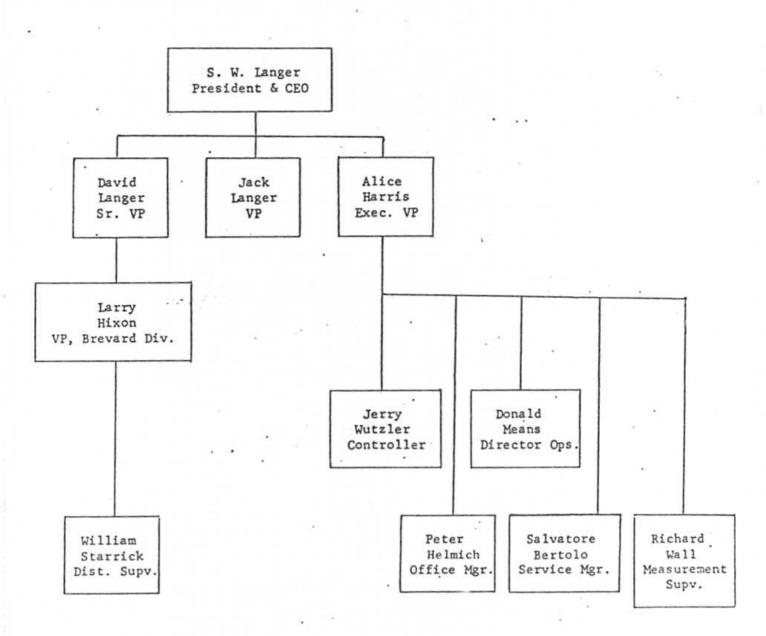

Item 9: Legal Proceedings

The case before the U. S. Tax Court on the taxability of customer deposits has been culminated. On May 27, 1980, a judgement was rendered in favor of the Company. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) appealed, and on October 21, 1982, the Court of Appeals reversed the decision and remanded the case to the Tax Court for further proceedings. On January 26, 1984, the Tax Court found in favor of the IRS, reversing its earlier position. The Company decided not to appeal, and started negotiations with the IRS for a settlement with respect to the methodology to be applied under the regulations. The settlement was completed, and accepted by the Tax Court on August 7, 1984. Hence the Company is now paying income tax on customer deposits.

In April, 1983, Consolidated Gas Company of Florida, Inc. ("Consolidated") filed suit against the Company in the U. S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida, alleging violations of federal antitrust laws and seeking injunctive and treble damage relief. The Company denied the allegations and filed a counterclaim alleging that Consolidated's practices constituted federal antitrust violations. Management and the Company's special counsel believe that the Company has good defenses and is likely to prevail on the claim against it.

In another case before the Florida Eleventh Judicial Circuit, the Company has filed suit against California Minicomputer Systems Inc. ("CMS") for damages from breach of contract resulting from deficient design and installation of a computer hilling and record system. CMS has filed a counterclaim for replevin and damages.

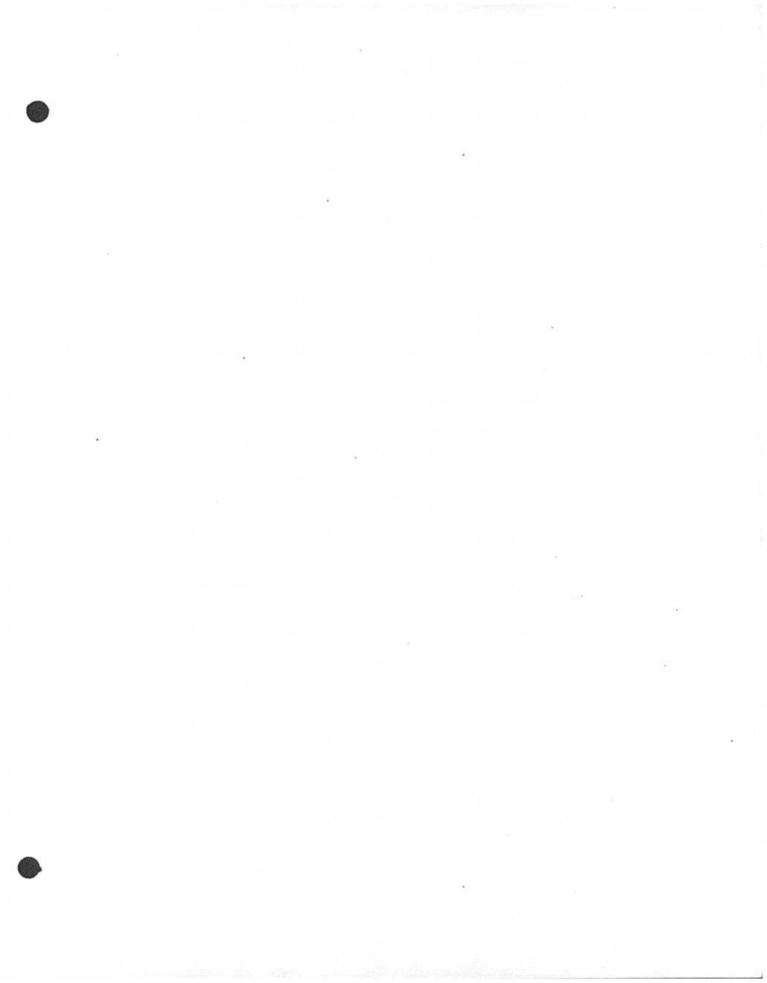
