(Sometimes called gross heating value or total heating value.)

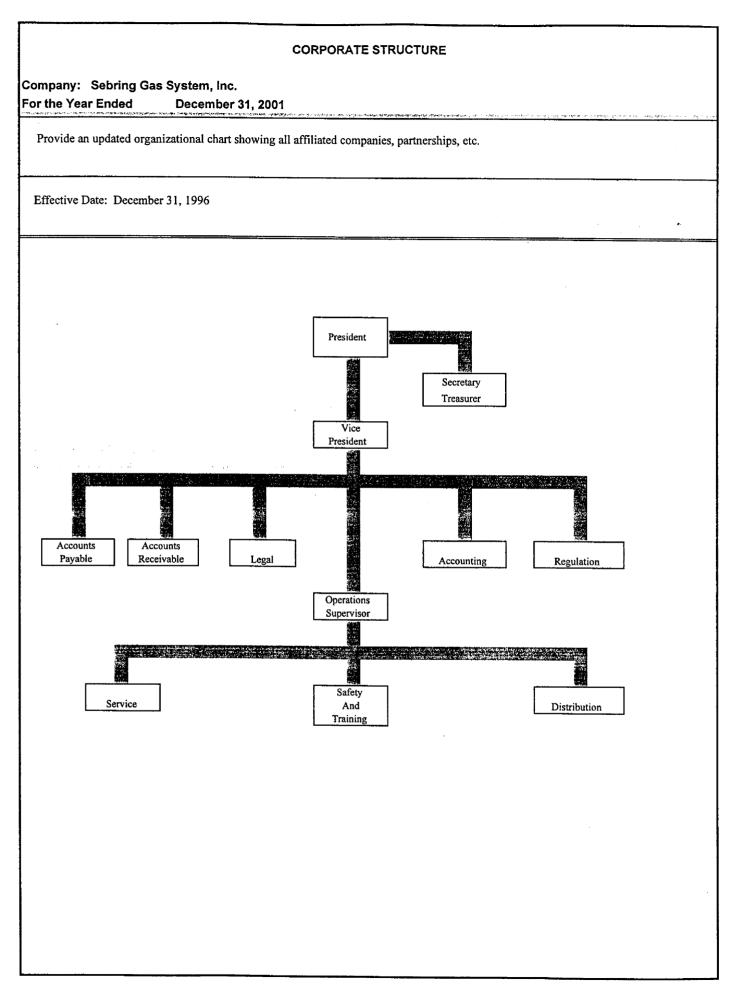
