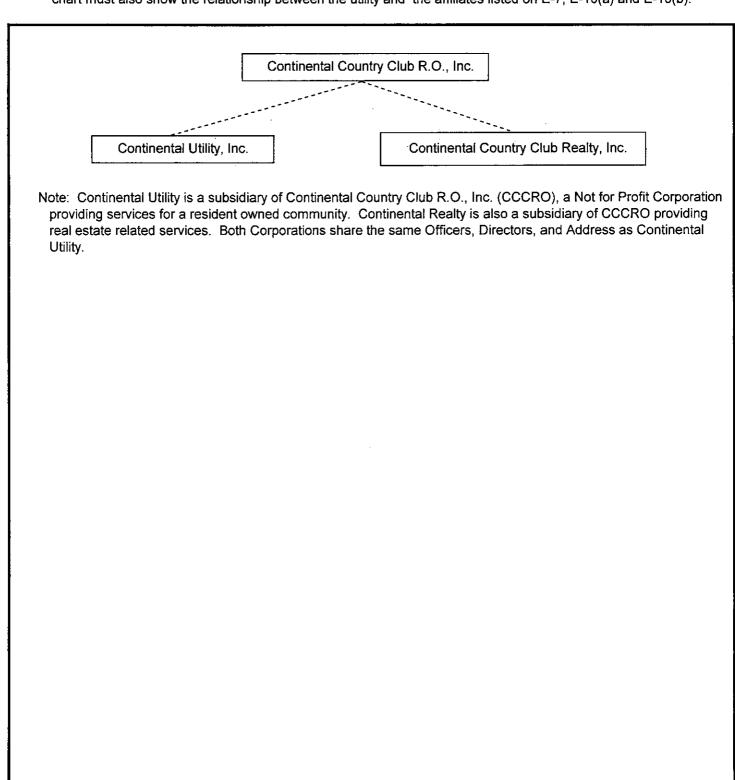

On January 13, 1987, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners transferred jurisdiction over privately owned water and wastewater utilities to the Florida Public Service Commission. On August 22, 1988, Continental Country Club, Inc. was granted water and wastewater certificates under the grandfathering provisions of Section 367.171, F.S. On September 19, 1989, Continental Country Club, Inc. transferred certificates 506-W and 440-S to Continental Utility, Inc. pursuant to Order No. 21910.
- (B) The Company provides water and sewer service to approximately 800 mobile home units, a 104 unit master metered condominium complex, a clubhouse, sales and maintenance offices, and a pool. The Company was last granted a water and wastewater rate increase on November 14, 1991 pursuant to Order No. 25347, as amended by Order No's. 25347-A and 25347-3.
