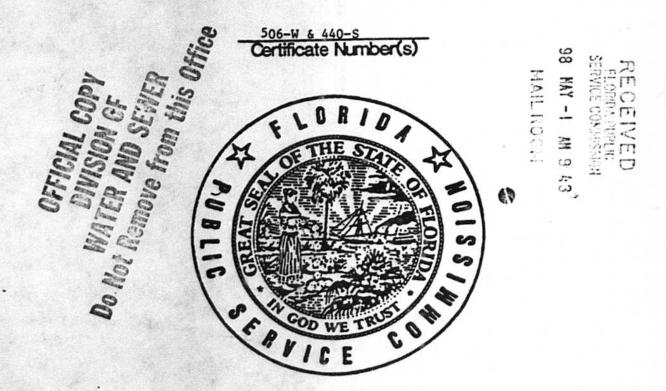

The predecessors to Continental Utility, Inc. began providing water and sewer service to its earliest customers in 1973. The Utility's service area is wholly within Sumter County, Florida. On January 13, 1987, the Sumter County Board of County Commissioners transferred jurisdiction over privately owned water and wastewater utilities to the Public Service commission. On August 22, 1988, Continental Country Club, Inc. was granted water and wastewater certificates under the grandfathering provisions of Section 367.171, Florida Statutes. On September 19, 1989, Continental Country Club, Inc. transferred certificates 506-W and 440-S to Continental Utility, Inc. pursuant to Order No. 21910. Continental Utility, Inc. continues to provide water and wastewater service to approximately 800 mobile home units, a 104-unit master-metered condominium complex, a clubhouse, sales and maintenance offices and a pool. The company was last granted a water and waterwater rate increase on November 14, 1991, pursuant to Order No. 25347 as amended by Order Nos. 25347-A and 25347-3. Continental seeks to provide its customers with safe and efficient service meeting all applicable health, safety, and environmental standards at rates that adequately cover the cost of service and provide a fair return to Continental on its investment. Continental Country Club R.O., Inc., a resident owners corporation, owns 100% of the stock of Continental Utility, Inc. Presently, Continental Utility, Inc. is experiencing growth at less than 10 additional customers per year. In 1995, Continental negotiated settlement and consent orders with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. As a result, Continental has changed their effluent disposal method by acquiring additional land and converting to a spray irrigation system and has stopped discharging effluent into the Chitty-Chatty Marsh.
